1. Introduction

This Programme Specification sets out the requirements for delivery of the Enhanced AS Level Programme. It provides an overview of the programme requirements, including learner eligibility and entry conditions; and details the data submission requirements to enable Medr to monitor programme delivery and learning outcomes for the Enhanced AS Level Programme.

This Specification also forms part of the Agreement between Institutions and the Welsh Ministers for the delivery and funding of Enhanced Learning Programmes. You must ensure that your Enhanced AS Level Programme provision adheres to this Programme Specification.

Four programmes of study are currently available, all at level 3.

2. Purpose of the Programme

The Enhanced AS Level Programme is a one-year programme, which has been developed to enhance the knowledge and skills required by learners undertaking AS Levels, ensuring retention and progression onto A Levels.

3. Delivery Overview

Each programme should be delivered on a full-time basis.

The following table outlines the number of hours that are required for each programme of learning. It is not expected that Colleges deliver the exact number of hours for each area but presents a general guide. It is however expected that total delivery hours are within a reasonable tolerance¹ of the funded hours.

4. Learner Eligibility and Entry Requirements

To be eligible for entry onto the programme a learner must be aged 16 or over on 31 August, immediately prior to the commencement of the programme.

¹ For audit purposes the reasonable tolerance is considered 10%.

Please note that Medr also expects priority to be given, in the first instance, to those learners aged 16 to 18 on the 31 August, immediately prior to the commencement of the programme².

The following minimum requirements will apply for all entrants to the Enhanced AS Level Programme:

- a minimum of 5 GCSEs at grade C or above,
- <u>at least one</u> grade C must be achieved in:

<u>either</u>

- o GCSE Mathematics / GCSE Mathematics Numeracy or
- o GCSE English / GCSE Welsh (First) Language

Learners must also:

- undertake either 3 or 4 AS Levels; and
- be at risk of not progressing to the A Levels.

Colleges may want to set higher eligibility criteria if previous experience suggests completion and successful outcome require more than the minimum set out in this document.

5. Programme Content

In line with the requirements set out in the *Post-16 Funding Framework* – *Guide and Programmes Directory*³, each programme must follow the same basic structure as other full-time general education programmes, namely:

- Main Qualification(s); and
- Community Learner Industry Focus (CLIF).

The additional hours of learning, compared to the non-enhanced AS Level Programmes, <u>must focus</u> on at least one of the following areas:

- enhancing numerical knowledge and skills for STEM subjects (e.g. Mathematics for Chemists);
- enhancing literacy skills for STEM subjects (e.g. developing comprehension and extended writing);
- enhancing oral practice and grammar for Languages;
- enhancing scientific knowledge for Physical Education / Health and Social Care;
- participation in Research Skills workshops to support the three projects in the new Skills Baccalaureate Wales and Extended Project Qualifications (EPQ)
- participation in Enterprise and Employability workshops (e.g. 'career ready' sessions, career coach, enterprise sessions);
- preparation for University entrance exams and interviews;
- preparation for skills competitions, Olympiads, Maths Challenge.

² A learner is considered to be age 18 until the end of the academic year in which their nineteenth birthday falls. This definition ensures that the funding of a 16 to 18 year-old learner does not change during an individual's programme if the learner becomes 19 years old during an academic year.

6. Data Submission Requirements

Medr will use data from the Lifelong Learning Wales Record (LLWR) / Pupil Level Annual School Census (PLASC) to monitor programme delivery and learning outcomes for the Enhanced AS Level Programme.

In line with the conditions set out in the annual *Grant Award Letter*, institutions must ensure that data is submitted in the correct format and in a timely manner.

The LLWR User Support Manual⁴ and the PLASC Technical Completion Notes⁵ set out the guidelines that institutions should follow when submitting data for the current academic year.

Programme Codes

The following programme codes (LP74) should be used for learners on the Enhanced AS Level Programmes:

Funding Model

Full Enhanced AS Level Programme funding⁶ can be drawn by the Further Education Institutions up to a maximum of 10% from the total of each relevant cohort as follows:

7. Monitoring and Audit

Monitoring and audit will play a role in ensuring that the guidance is being applied consistently and to help assess whether policies, procedures and controls are adequate.

Monitoring Approach

The approach to monitoring will focus on the following areas:

- compliance with the programme's specifications; and
- learning outcomes for the programme.

This will be achieved through a combination of in-year and end-of year monitoring; a data matching exercise; and detailed audit testing of learners on Enhanced Programmes.

Compliance with Programme Specification

Medr will use LLWR / PLASC data to monitor compliance with the programme specification. This will include monitoring of the data from the programme and activity datasets to check that programme delivery requirements are being met in full.

Learning Outcomes

Learner destination is a key performance measure for the programme and crucial in evaluating programme delivery.

It is expected that the vast majority of learners who successfully complete the Enhanced AS Levels Programme will progress onto full-time A Level Programmes.

Audit Testing

In addition to the approach to monitoring set out above, all data returned by the Further Education institutions will be subject to existing end of year audit requirements⁷. Within this, a particular emphasis will be placed in the *Auditors' Notes for Guidance* to ensure that external auditors appropriately sample learners undertaking the Enhanced Programmes.
