What's new

The participation national measure has been updated with data for 2021/22 and 2022/23. For more information and the methodology please refer to our latest data requirements circular outlined above.

For widening access, part-time, student mobility, PGR, PhDs and transnational education national measures, UK totals have been updated to include student alternative data for 2015/16 to 2021/22. The original UK total line excluding student alternative data has been retained, and a new UK total has been added. This does not affect the participation national measure which has always included student alternative data in the UK totals.

For reasearch income, and research council income the UK total line has been amended to reflect HESA Open data for 2019/20 and 2021/22.

Future changes

The retention National Measure is still currently based on data from the UK Performance Indicators (PIs) which were published by HESA for the last time in 2022. We are currently working on a methodology to enable us to update the retention measure.

Notes

General notes that apply to all or most measures are outlined below. For specific information relating to each measure please refer to the notes below each measure.

Data for FEIs is not available for all targets.

The following data disclosure control policy has been applied. This means that for all data relating to individuals:

- All numbers are rounded up or down to the nearest multiple of 5. Any number lower than 2.5 is rounded to 0. Halves are rounded upwards (e.g. 2.5 is rounded to 5).
- Percentages are calculated on unrounded data. Percentages calculated on populations which contain fewer than 22.5 individuals are suppressed and represented as ".".
- Totals are calculated on unrounded data and therefore may not appear to be the sum of the individual rounded data.

The **Data Futures** programme was implemented for the **2022/23 HESA student record**. There were difficulties with the return caused by delays to the functionality of the HESA Data Platform, late software updates, late supply of data quality rules by Jisc and other issues. This may have resulted in data quality issues which impact on student data based National Measures. We recieved several manual amendments to this data which has been included and noted in the footnotes of each measure where relevant. Data for FEIs was suppressed in 2016/17 employment PIs and is also suppressed here.

*2016/17 employment PI data used here is the sum of the employment PI for UK domiciled leavers graduating from full-time and part-time undergraduate courses.

The employment PI excluded data for combinations of mode & level where the response rate was less than 85%. This data is also excluded here.

2017/18 onwards, GO data

For 2017/18 leavers onwards, the Graduate Outcomes (GO) survey was introduced, surveying graduates 15 months after leaving. This means that there is a break in continuity between 2016/17 and 2017/18 data, due to changes in survey methodology and length of time surveyed following completion of studies. Any comparisons between 2016/17 and 2017/18 should be made with caution.

The population is split into four cohorts and graduates are surveyed at different times of the year depending on the cohort they fall into. This is determined by when the graduate completed their studies.

For example, from the total population of 2018/19 leavers:

Students who completed their studies between 1 August 2018 and 31 October 2018 were surveyed in cohort A, commencing December 2019.

Students who completed their studies between 1 November 2018 and 31 January 2019 were surveyed in cohort B, commencing March 2020.

Students who completed their studies between 1 February 2019 and 30 April 2019 were surveyed in cohort C, commencing June 2020.

Students who completed their studies between 1 May 2019 and 31 July 2019 were surveyed in cohort D, commencing September 2020.

Any comparisons between 2016/17 and 2017/18 should be made with caution.

The population is split into four cohorts and graduates are surveyed at different times of the year depending on the cohort they fall into. This is determined by when the graduate completed their studies. For example, from the total population of 2018/19 leavers:

Students who completed their studies between 1 May 2019 and 31 July 2019 were surveyed in cohort D, commencing September 2020.
