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About the Learner Engagement Code



We are called **Medr**. Our job is to check some education settings in Wales. These are places where you learn.



We made this Learner Engagement Code. Your school, college or adult community learning provider must follow the Code.



The Code is to make sure you, the learner, are listened to.



It means you can:

- Take part in decisions.
- Have your views heard.
- Share your thoughts about your learning.

This will help you:



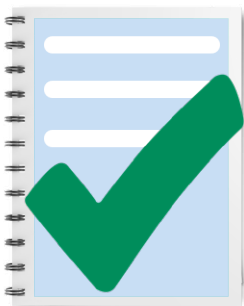
- Share your views easily.



- Be part of making changes and improving things.



- Find out what happened because of your views.



The Code should help make learning better for you.

How you can get involved

There are lots of ways you can get involved.
You could:



- Fill in surveys.



- Speak to your teacher or tutor.



- Take part in meetings.



- Join a learner council or students' union. Learner councils and students' unions are groups of learners who share ideas and represent learners.

What schools, colleges and adult community learning providers must do

The Code is for:



- Colleges



- Universities



- Training providers for Apprenticeships. This is where you learn while doing a job.



- Adult and community learning.



- School sixth forms.



As part of the Code, your school, college or adult community learning provider must:



- Work with learners and learner groups.



- Make a learner engagement commitment. This explains how learners will be involved.



- Make sure you are part of decisions.



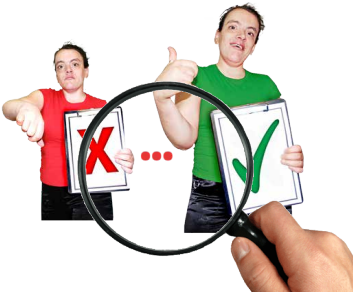
- Show what changed because learners shared their views.

How we will check

We will check that your education provider follows the Code. We will:



- Check your learner engagement commitment.



- Check how it has made a difference.



- Ask learners for their views.

- Ask organisations like Estyn how well they think learner engagement is being done.



We can tell your school, college or adult learning provider to make changes.



We can support them to improve.



We can share ideas about what things are being done that work well.

Important values

The Learner Engagement Code is based on important values. Some of these values are:



- You should be part of decisions.



- You feel valued and listened to.



- Everyone is included.



- You can use Welsh or English.



- You should be part of making changes and improving things.

Decisions you can help make



You could help decide what kind of courses are offered.



You could help decide when and where courses take place.



You could help decide what equipment learners need.



You could share your views on things like dress code, phone use, or where vaping is allowed.



You could share your views on changes to learning sessions.



You could have a say about wellbeing or how to give feedback.



There are many other things you can have a say on.



The Learner Engagement Code helps you improve your learning.



It also helps learners have a say and make decisions across Wales.
